reading at the pace best suited for them, and better yet, they'll be reading books you know they're interested in because you'll handpick them based on their interests

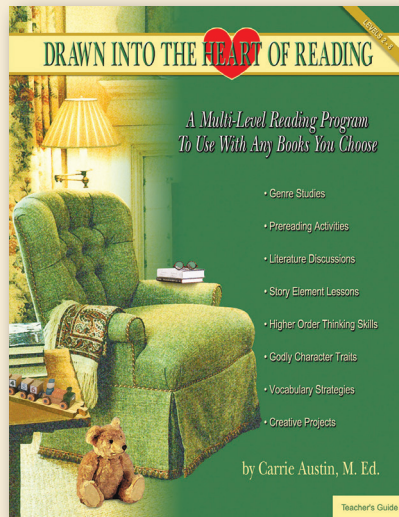

*Drawn Into the Heart of Reading* features 9 incredible units with complete reading plans organized around the 9 different genres of literature. This ensures that your children will read from every type of literature and results in your children not only learning the necessary skills for each type of literature, but also with them finding new kinds of books to love! These genres can be taught in any order, so you can start with their favorite types of books or choose an order that matches other topics you're studying. Genre kickoffs, prereading activities, story element lessons, Godly character traits, vocabulary activities, graphic

organized workbooks, discussion questions, and creative projects all work together to fashion an exciting, thorough approach to reading. Finally, you can totally enjoy teaching your children reading, with the peaceful assurance that all of your “bases are covered”!

In the “Genre Kickoff” part of the program, your children will be introduced to each new genre in a fun and entertaining way. A list of inventive genre kickoffs is given at the beginning of each unit, so you can pick the one that most tickles your fancy! For the “biography” genre, maybe you'll have your child gather 5 objects special to him in a sack, and then take them out one at a time, sharing why each thing is important. Or, maybe you have an



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artistic child, so you'll choose the kickoff that has your child make a scrapbook page telling biographical details about herself. Or, perhaps you've got a "mover and a shaker" of a child, so you'll choose the kickoff that has your child take a tour of your house and note what can be discovered about each family member. Whatever genre kickoff you choose, your child is sure to enjoy it and find out more about the upcoming genre at the same time!

In the "Godly character traits" part of the program, your children will learn important character traits with each genre. Each trait has a simple definition and a key Scripture verse. Children use their Bibles to read about a Biblical character who showed the trait, listen to you as you share a time in your life when you've shown that trait, search for characters in their books whom are – or are not – showing the trait, and finally search their own hearts for evidence of that trait. This soul-searching part of the program not only helps children want to become the best person they can be, it also helps you as a parent have a Biblical method already in place for discussing book characters' behavior!

In the "story element lessons" part of the program, lessons connect story elements with the genres they'd most naturally match. So in the "adventure" genre, "problem/conflict" is studied, in the "mystery" genre, "prediction/inference" is studied, and so on. This instruction is often either missing in younger reading programs, or is often taught in such a sporadic way that it is

quickly forgotten. In contrast, *Drawn Into the Heart of Reading* recognizes that story element instruction taught in a natural and meaningful way at younger ages paves the way for success with future in-depth literature studies. Likewise, a few well-chosen discussion questions give the cozy feeling of taking part in a book club, while also encouraging better comprehension and analyzing of characters.

Finally, the "creative projects" part of the program will have your children ending each genre unit study with a bang! Three project options are always offered to ensure your children can find a project to get excited about, and each project is designed to reinforce the genre while also celebrating completing the unit. One of the options is always character trait-based, another is book-based, and the final option is a group project. For example, when completing the genre "historical fiction", your child might create a faith encouragement card for someone experiencing hardship, or make a mask representing an integral character from one of the book(s) he read, or work with other family members to perform a character role play of a social event from the historical time period that was studied. Five days of plans at the end of each unit are set aside for the creative project that is chosen, which gives more than enough time for completion. Each of these projects also has simple detailed directions and a reflection form to do at the end, making this creative project time truly doable and enjoyable for both the children and the parent!

Simply circle the rectangle in each ROW that best describes your child. The COLUMN with the most circles is the most appropriate placement for your child. If you have more than one child, a good strategy is to use a different color marker for each child. If your child is not an independent reader, see the choices in our "Little Hearts" series for phonics or emerging readers instead. If your child is high school-aged and beyond the skills in this chart, see our literature study in our "Hearts for Him Through High School" series instead.

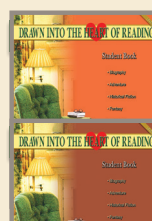

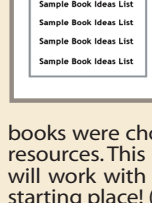

# So, come on over and take a peek at the Drawn Into the Heart of Reading Teacher's Guide!

**Teacher Directed**

**Focus:** Prereading Activity - Secret Passages

**Preparation:**

- Prior to meeting with the students for day 1, follow the directions for Getting Started listed in the back of this guide.
- Have the first book and one Assigned Reading Calendar ready for each student.
- You will need a folder or barrier of some sort between you and the students, so if you can hide the covers of the books with the passages for today's lesson. If you have only 1 student, you will need to have several books from this genre beside the book he or she will be reading.

**Lesson:**

- Say, Today we will be doing a prereading activity to help you think about the read book you will be reading.
- Set out the books the students will be reading, but do not tell them who will be reading which book. Allow the students to briefly look at the titles, covers, and illustrations for a few minutes.
- Say, I will be reading several sentences from one of these books to you. Your job will be to guess which book has that passage.
- Hide all the books behind your "barrier" and read a few sentences from one of the books. Then, set out the books in front of the students and have them guess which book had that passage. Have students give reasons for their choices.
- After each student has guessed, show students which book contains the passage.
- Continue steps 3, 4, and 5 until you have read several parts from each book.
- Give students the books you have chosen for them. Allow them time to carefully read the title, look at the front cover, read the synopsis, and look at the illustrations.

**Biography - Day 1**

9. Discuss the following questions with your students:

- What question(s) would you like to ask the person in your book?
- What made you think of that question?
- What makes you book a biography?

Students open their Student Books to the Assigned Reading Calendar for the genre. Help each student fill in the page numbers to be read for days 1-5. Students read the assigned pages for day 1 on their own.

**Teacher Directed**

**Biography - Day 2**

**Level 2/3**

**Focus:** Story Discussion and Optional Phonics or Vocabulary Work

**Preparation:**

- You may choose to have students at this level review phonics or complete a vocabulary assignment. Use your own program for the phonics review. Refer to the Appendix for a reproducible vocabulary assignment. The lesson on this day is much shorter to compensate for the additional time you may spend on phonics or on vocabulary work.

**Lesson:**

- Optional phonics or vocabulary work
- Listen to your students read the assigned pages out loud to you. Use the Reading Strategies list and the Qualities of Good Reading list provided in the Appendix to help you know what to emphasize.
- Discuss the following questions with your students:
  - How would you describe this person?
  - What problems does this person have up to this point in the biography?
  - Where is this story taking place? Describe the place.

**Independent / Teacher Directed**

**Focus:** Story Element Instruction - Character Web

**Level 4/5**

**Lesson:**

- Tell the students to read the assigned pages on their own, leaving 3-4 pages to read aloud to you.
- Listen to your students read several pages. Use the Qualities of Good Reading list provided in the Appendix to help you know what to emphasize.
- Work with the students to complete the Character Web on day 2 in the Student Book. List at least 3-4 examples for each category on the web. You may want to write answers on a marker board as you discuss them, so the students can copy them. Then, the students can concentrate better on the discussion.
- Discuss the following question with your students:
  - How are you similar to the person in this biography?

**Biography - Day 2**

**Independent**

**Focus:** Vocabulary Builder - Prediction Practice

**Level 6/7/8**

**Preparation:**

- Have a dictionary available.

**Lesson:**

- The students complete the activities in the Student Book and read the assigned pages for day 2 on their own.
- The directions instruct students to come and show you the completed Prediction Practice vocabulary assignment.

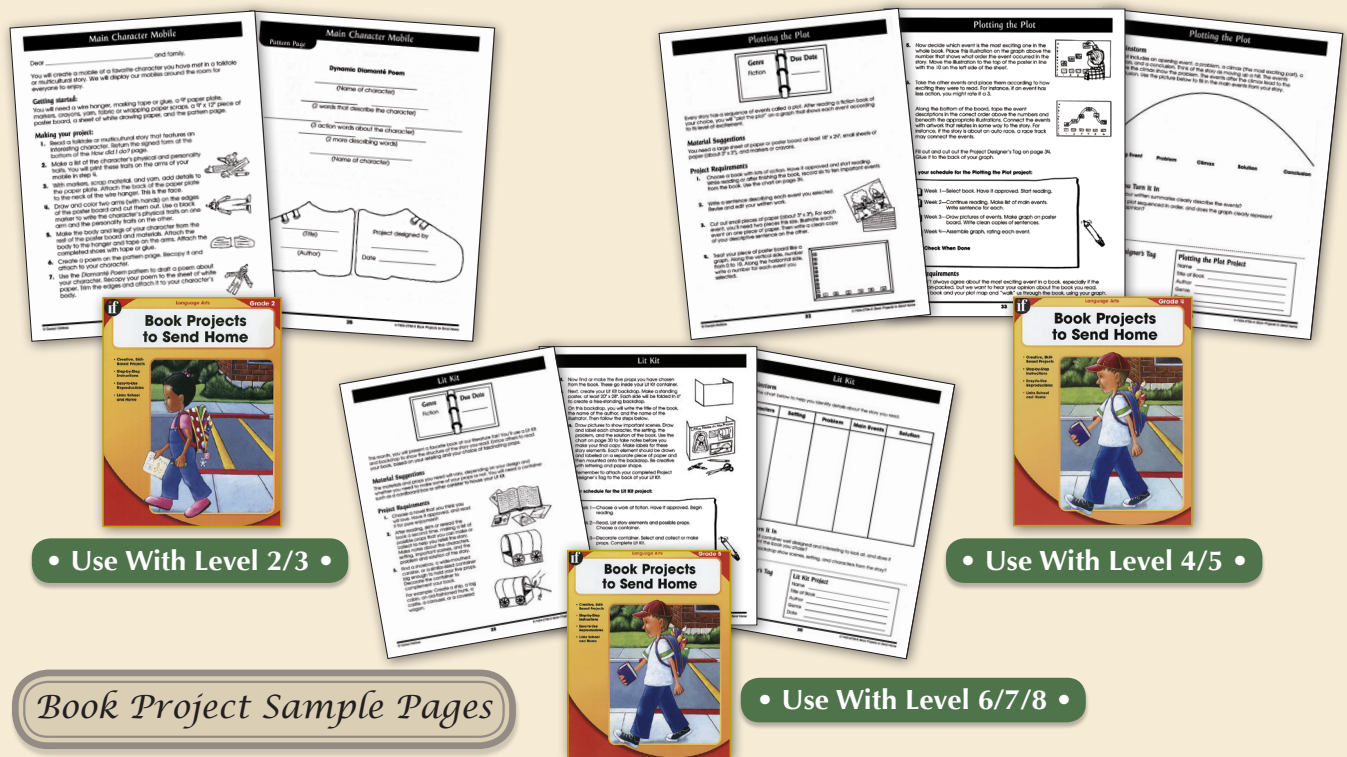

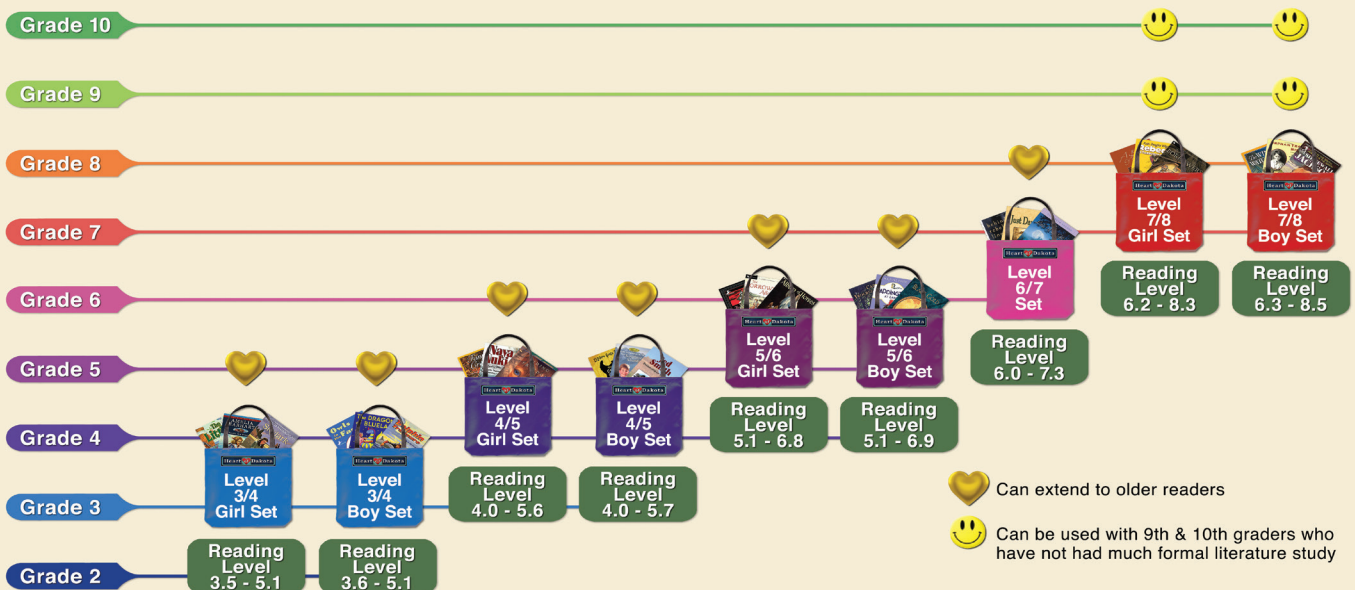
